



THE PREAMBLE

"We, the People of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into Sovereign Socialist Secular Democratic Republic, and to secure to all citizens:

JUSTICE - social, economic and political; LIBERTY of thought, expression, faith, belief and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY, assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the nation;"

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY, this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, DO HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The year 1975 was significant for two reasons – for its being the international women's year and also for the establishment of Visakha Women's' College by a noted freedom fighter and social worker Sri. Singavarapu Surya Rao. As the founder president of the Visakha Women's College late Sri Singavarapu Surya Rao had struggled hard for promoting the cause women's education. Smt. Rama Kumari Devi, the Rani Saheba of Jeypur, Orissa was kind enough to give her summer resort palace on the beach road, popularly known as HawaMahal for the college on a nominal rent. Eminent educationists and the philanthropic public who rendered their services to the college include Smt. D.Saraswathi Devi, Justice Smt. JaganMohini, Sri Wjunnava Rama Rao and Sri. Kancharla Rama Chandra Rao.

I. MILE STONES IN THE HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE:

- ➤ In 1975 the College was started as a composite college with both intermediate and degree Oclasses.
- ➤ The college is spread over in 4.11 acres of land after road expansion.
- ➤ The College was sanctioned grant in aid in 1978.
- ➤ In the year 1983 the Composite college was bifurcated into Visakha Degree College for Women and Visakha Junior College for Women.
- As the HawaMahal became old and unsuitable, the College was shifted to VUDA buildings, Siripuram for some time.
- Finally the College was shifted in 1992 to the present premises, the erstwhile Borstal School Campus belonging to Central Prison as it was taken over by the Govt. of Andhra Pradesh vide G.O. Rt. No. 2136 EDN Dt. 22-11-1992.

The original sheds were replaced by permanent buildings as

per the master plan.





- Funds were secured from the Department of Higher Education's, MPLADS, Visakha Municipal Corporation, Port Trust, Visakha Urban Development Authority, UGC and Philanthropic Public
- ➤ With the benevolent gestures and directions of the honorable Chief Minister Dr. Y. S. Rajasekhar Reddy, Visakha Urban Development Authority constructed permanent buildings to Degree and Junior Colleges separately.
- ➤ Initially the college offered B.A. and B.Com. Courses and later B.Sc. was added in 1998. P.G. Courses were started in the year 2003.

VISION and MISSION of the institution:

Visakha Govt. Degree & PG College for women was established to cater to the needs of lower middle classes and poorer sections of the society who cannot afford education in the private corporate colleges. To facilitate value based education to these sections is our avowed motto. Empowerment of women through education is the ultimate goal.

VI. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:

1. Every Student must invariably wear the college uniform.

- 2. No student shall be permitted to enter the classes after 10.00 AM.
- 3. Biometric attendance is a must.
- 4. Attendance will be given only if they are in the classes by the time the teacher takes the roll call.
- 5. Students are instructed to park their vehicles only in the parking place.
- 6. The students have to carry the college identity cards on all the working days.
- 7. Students found outside the lecture halls when classes are in session will be dealt seriously.
- 8. Every student to whom books, laboratory apparatus or other property of the college are entrusted for their preservation in good condition and in the event of their being lost or damaged shall be required to replace them or repay the cost.
- 9. Students are required to help in keeping the class rooms and premises clean and tidy.
- 10.Ragging, quarrelling with other students and teachers, defacing the walls, throwing out waste paper, loitering, creating nuisance, organizing unauthorized meetings or entertainments at the college or collecting money for any purpose within the college without the written permission of the Principal are punishable offences.
- 11. Students guilty of going over to other colleges to take part in acts of indiscipline such as organizing demonstrations

- and strikes would be punished accordingly.
- 12. Students shall not hold meetings to criticize the conduct of the university or authorities of the college. Such meetings shall be deemed unlawful and the Principal might take action and if she considers it very serious, to report to the syndicate under section 3 of Chapter VII of the code of rustication.
- 13. Means of involving in violence to self or to others or coercion direct or indirect adopted by students, such as hunger strike for enforcing their will on the college or the university shall be either punished by the college authorities or reported to the syndicate.
- 14. The name of the college shall not be used in any publication in any manner or giving any statement to the press without the permission of the Principal.
- 15.No class or group of students should engage themselves in any public activity without the permission of the principal.
- 16. The class representatives shall be unanimously elected by the concerned class students. There shall be one class representative for each class/group.

VII. ATTENDANCE

- 1. Absence for any period or more in a session will be regarded as absence for that session.
- 2. Every student should put in a minimum attendance of 75% in theory classes and 90% attendance in the practical classes.
- 3. All scholarship holders should put in a minimum of 75% attendance to get the amount of their scholarship.

Extract from: Rule No. 219 (K) of Andhra Pradesh Education Rules. The concessions granted are liable to be withdrawn in all cases of misconduct.

Extract from the proceedings of D.P.I: C.No. 2044/T-4.3/68, Dt. 25-6-68. "It has been decided by the Government that Scholarships sanctioned under various schemes shall be withdrawn/suspended/terminated/cancelled, as the case may be irrespective of their nature when scholars go on strike or indulge in activities "subversive of discipline or public peace and order. This step has to be taken to induce a sense of discipline among scholarship holders. They being the beneficiaries out of public funds can rightly be compelled to behave better and set an example to others".

IX COLLEGE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (CPDC)

CONSTITUTION OF CPDC:

- ➤ The Principal (President) concerned will nominate all the members in consultation with the staff council of the college
- ➤ The lecturer members should be one senior lecturer and two lecturers from GCTA AP, GCGTA-AP.
- ➤ The members will elect the secretary of the CPDC.
- > The usual term of a member of the committee is two years.
- ➤ The principal and lecturer will cease to be members if they are transferred or retired. The new principal will

automatically become the president. The parent member will lose his or her membership when the studies of their ward are completed. The vacancies of members will be filled in by the president from time to time.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To create a suitable environment and a mechanism for community participation in the planning and development of college without interfering with the rules and regulations of functioning.
- 2. To create a mechanism whereby public contributions can be mobilized for the development of the college.
- 3. To enable the community to advise and assist in introducing relevant courses of study in the college based on the needs of the area and to improve the quality of education.
- 4. To act as an active medium between the college and the community for mutual benefit.
- 5. To help creating the congenial climate for academic, cultural, social service oriented activities.

POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE CPDC:

1. To work for the furtherance of the objectives of the CPDC.

- 2. To prepare a detailed plan, with annual budgetary allocations, for college development and to execute developmental programmes.
- 3. To generate a separate CPDC fund and to utilize the CPDC fund solely for the benefit of the students.
- 4. To operate money-matters by opening a separate account for CPDC fund in a nationalized bank.

X STUDENT – SUPPORTING SERVICES

The college offers a number of student supporting services such as scholarships, students Union, Central Library, Reading Room, Health Centre, games and Sports, Canteen, Career Guidance, Grievance Redressal cell, NCC, NSS, Internet, Audio-Visual Department, Mana TV, Student Counseling System, Assessment of Students, Botanical Garden, VCPAC, Associations and Committees, Internal Complaints Committees, Certificate courses, Add on courses, Guest Lecturers, Seminars, Workshops, Diploma courses, Mentor-Mentee system.

a) Mid Semester examinations

Assessment of Students

The performance of the students is assessed by conducting monthly tests and mid semesters. The marks of the monthly and periodical tests are recorded in the departmental marks registers and central marks registers. The progress of the students in examinations is monitored by the class counselors concerned. Slow & Advanced learners are identified and remedial classes , study assignments and projects will be arranged.

b) Student Counseling System/LOCO-Parent/Mentor-Mentee System The students require proper motivation, guidance and counseling to achieve high academic standards, to develop their literary and cultural talents and to secure employment opportunities. Therefore, they are entrusted to the care of lecturers who will act as their "friend, philosopher and guide".

The counselors have to motivate their wards to aim high and achieve academic distinction, and also to participate in extra-curricular activities in addition to respecting traditions, rules and regulations in the college.


The counselors can also extend their help in several administrative matters like processing identity cards, bus concession forms, month-wise attendance, notifying shortage of attendance, arranging special coaching, sending progress reports, guiding the student while filling the examination applications, recommending the cases to condone shortage in attendance, awarding proficiency prizes etc.,

The student counseling system will help to establish a good rapport between the staff and the students.

Central Library:

There is a spacious library with a huge collection of books in all subjects for the use and reference of students and staff. The lists of the subject wise books are catalogued and computerized. Books will be issued to the students systematically. There are a total number of 14928 books in the central library.

There is a separate reading room in the college library. It will be open from 10AM to 5PM. Various reference books, magazines, journals, periodicals, news papers, old question papers of the university, AUCET material will be kept there for the use of the students. Strict silence should be maintained in the reading room. They should only refer the reading materials but should not take them out

a) NCC

NCC is an important organization of our country NCC unit was sanctioned to the college in the year 2017. Total strength of NCC cadets are 80. Cadet Y. Manasa participated in independence Day celebrations, Vijayawada on 15th August 2019 and many cadets attended for NCC national camps CATC I, II, III, ATC III etc., at OP Zindal schools Vizianagaram and Andhra University. Dr. K. Sudha is the present coordinator.

b) NSS:

The role of social service organizations has attained great significance in recent times. Our college has 3 units of NSS with strength of 300 volunteers. The unit started in the academic year 1999-2000. Our students participated in a number of social service activities like clean and green, field study, Swatch Bharath, awareness campaigns, blood donation camps, World No Tobacco Day, Swach Sarvekshana, Yoga Day Swachtha pakwada, Awareness on anti ragging, Poshan Abhiyan, Breast feeding week, Coastal cleaning Ek bharath sreshta bharath etc., the co-ordinaters are Unit-I Dr. N. c) VC PAC:

As the world is becoming increasingly stressful, the need for equipping the girls with the right skills is also increased. Keeping this in view our college started VISAKHA COUNCELLING and PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESMENT CENTER (VC PAC) in Jan 2002.

The objectives of VC PAC are to improve the health condition of the students and solve their psychological problems through counseling, health check up. The aim of VC PAC is to see that the students of our college leave with not only a degree in hand but also with a healthy mind in a healthy body.

d) JKC (Jawahar Knowledge Centre):

Jawahar Knowledge Centre (JKC) was established in the college in 2006-07 which helps students to learn and practice employability skills and communication skills. JKC provides solution to the problems faced by students studying non-professional courses in Govt. Degree Colleges, since the inception of the departments of JKC, it has been conducting job drives and providing placements to the JKC trained students in various companies including MNC along with placement department of the college. 
