Being a women college, gender disparity does not exist among the students but the major concern is to ensure safety and security in the college and transform them as empowered individuals and competent enough to face the current global challenges through the gender sensitization programs. The college has a professional and ethical work culture where there is equal fairness to both men and women staff in terms of benefits and opportunities.

## 1. Safety and security:

• <u>CC Camera</u>: Being a women college the college prioritizes the safety of girl students and ensures security by initiating safety measures like installation of CC Cameras at various conspicuous locations in the college. This facility helps to track any case of misconduct in the college and security at the college entrance ensures good safety to the students.





- <u>Disciplinary committee</u>: The committee constituting the physical director as the convener and some teaching staff as members is formed to make sure that all the students strictly adhere to the guidelines pertaining to the code of conduct and this ensures the discipline of students.
- <u>Anti-ragging committee:</u> This committee functions to counsel the students and inculcate values in them so that any act of ragging is not allowed and inspire them to maintain cordial relations among the seniors and juniors.
- Health club and NSS unit frequently organizes health camps where the students get the basic health checkup done and get aware about the health and hygiene.
- Health Center facility is initiated in the college which comprises the necessary first aid kit during emergency and sanitary napkin dispensary during menstruation needs.



• Other facilities: The College provides some other facilities like fire extinguishers for emergency purposes.

# 2. Counseling:

Teachers are appointed as <u>class counselors</u> to have a better interaction with the concerned students. They act as mentors and guide them both academically and how to confront the social challenges in their life. Students get the academic and emotional support from their counselors which enable them to grow in their career and personal life.

<u>Internal complaints committee</u> is formed to address the grievances of the students and resolve the issue through counseling and implementing proper action.

VCPAC (Visakha Centre for psychological Assessment and counseling) is another significant initiative of the college with an objective to shape the student's behavior and help them with their academic and psychological issues through counseling. In this program psychology students perform as counselors and assist their clients on varied problems; the students from the other colleges can also be benefitted from this program.

# 3. Indoor & outdoor gymnasium and games:
